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2019 Methodology overview

 A methodology based on the identification of sustainable development topics at Rexel followed by interviews with stakeholders in order to prioritize them



activity in the entire value chain

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- 20 external interviews (experts, customers, suppliers)
- 16 internal interviews •
- **Internal survey** with the Group's ٠ sustainability experts

Topics identified as **priorities**

Identifying topics related to Rexel's activity in the entire value chain

- Pre-identifying environmental, social or ethical topics at Rexel with:
 - External sources: life cycle analysis results, media releases, NGO reports, suppliers' materiality analysis, followed by stakeholders' interviews in order to prioritize them
 - Internal sources: previous materiality analysis (2015), mapping of extra-financial risks (including Sapin2 law, Energy Transition for Green Growth law, GDPR), mapping of risks related to due diligence
- Defining the most significant topics by using the following rating system:

	Topic rating system
0	Irrelevent topic
1	Minor topic
2	Secondary topic. Medium risk and/or opportunity
3	Priority topic. Strong risk and/or opportunity

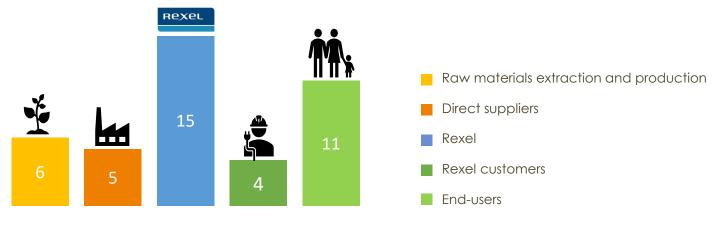


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Key topics identified in the entire value chain

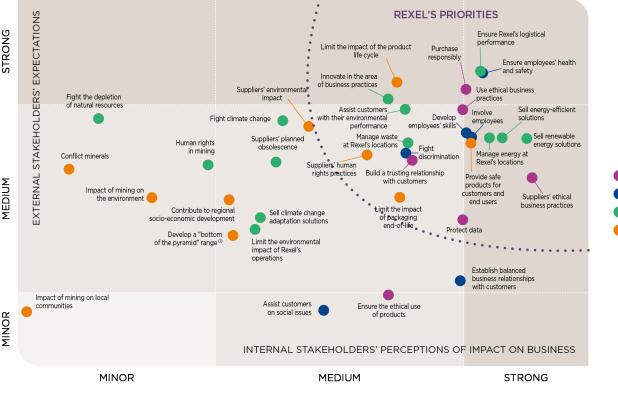
Prioritization of topics based on the interviewed stakeholders' expectations
